

# Logging Volunteer Hours: Freshers' Week Guide for Hall Committees

The volunteer recognition scheme monitors, acknowledges and rewards the hard work and commitment of volunteers making a difference within the St Andrews community. In order to earn the Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum Volunteering Awards, you must log your volunteer hours by using the Graduates Programme.

We all know how much volunteering is involved in being on a Hall Committee during Freshers' Week, and we want **you** to log these hours to gain recognition for it! This is just a short guide, for a fuller guide on how to use the Volunteer Portal, please see [HERE](#).

## How to log your hours

### Step one - signing up to a project



**A.** Make sure that you're signed up to log volunteer hours for your hall by going onto the Graduate Attributes portal and 'My volunteering' on the left-hand side panel. From here, go onto 'Hall Committee' and scroll until you find your hall. There might be multiple different activities under your hall that you can sign up for (we'd recommend ticking them all, if they're there!)

**B.** Then you need to press the big green 'Sign up now!'. An portal administrator will need to approve this, so please try to do this *before* Freshers' Week, and then you can get straight to logging!

### Step two – Logging hours!

**A.** On the Graduate Attributes Portal select 'Log an activity' on the panel on the left-hand side.

**B.** Input the date of the activity and choose the type (extra-curricular for Hall Committee activities).

**C.** Tick 'I want to log volunteer hours for his activity' and select 'Student Volunteering' from the activity type from the drop-down menu.

**D.** Give a description of the activity (see examples below) and select up to five relevant Graduate Attributes.

**E.** It will then take you to the next page, where you select the project you want to log hours for, input the start and end date and length in minutes and hours.

**F.** Then you need to upload your evidence (see examples) and press save!





Your hours will then show as 'unapproved' until an administrator either approves or rejects them! Getting into the habit of logging your hours weekly means that you can work towards the Bronze / Silver / Gold / Platinum volunteer awards which appear on your HEAR transcript.

## Examples

### Project and Activity

Hall Committee: University and Whitehorn Hall - Helping with Free Bar

### Hours Logged

5 hours 30 minutes

### Description

The hall had put in an order with Morrisons for the bars during Freshers' Week, so I helped sort and put away this order, which took 30 minutes as we had to reorganise the cupboard. I then helped set up for the cowboy themed event between 7-8pm. I then helped serve drinks at the themed free bar from 8pm to 11pm. Finally, I helped clean up by taking down decorations and washing jugs, which took one hour as we had a lot to do! This was a good opportunity for me to introduce myself to the first-year students while serving drinks, as it is important for my role as Wellbeing Officer for the Old Wing that students feel they can approach me.

### Project and Activity

Hall Committee: McIntosh Hall - Welcoming and Guiding Freshers

### Hours Logged

5 hours

### Description

I greeted and welcomed new members of McIntosh Hall on move-in day one. This involved standing at the door and guiding them to their rooms. I did this from 10am to 12 noon, and then from 1pm to 4pm. This was rewarding as it allowed me to introduce myself and promote our Freshers' Week event.

Social events can only be logged when there is a clear element of volunteering, such as being the Sober Rep or MC-ing the event or serving at the bar or leading / instructing the event. However, just attending events, even to 'make up numbers' cannot be logged.

Hall Committee: John Burnet Hall - Freshers' Week Graphics and Admin

## **Hours Logged**

3 hours 45 minutes

## **Description**

I created the graphics on Canva to advertise the hall events during Freshers' Week. There were 5 slides for this graphic, so it took me 45 minutes to make. I also created a 'Meet the Committee' post, which took me 30 minutes to make. Part of my role involves monitoring the Hall's Instagram account and responding to DMs. I spent 5 minutes each day since the 5<sup>th</sup> of August (30 days total, so 2.5 hours total) responding to these questions and adding people to the Hall WhatsApp group.
