Ms Andrew welcomed members and spoke of her desire for Councils meetings to be productive and to help officers make a difference. She spoke about her work on the redevelopment report that would be going to the University's Planning and Resources Committee, the annual block grant negotiations and fees – there would be news to come on all of these.

3.3 Report of the Association Director of Events and Services

Ms O'Connor reported a highly successful Freshers' Week with seven of ten events sold out completely. Thanks were minuted to Ents Crew, other volunteers, and staff. Week 1 would see a new Beacon bar cocktail and mocktail menu launched, as well as Monday Movie night and OMFG and the Bop. A new member of staff had been hired to assist the Design and Marketing Manager and would start on the 28th September. Finally, following the shop merger a student forum/focus group would be set up.

Freshers' Fayre had been a notable success. Ms Christie would be discussing budgets with subcommittees and was seeking feedback on room bookings. Societies training would take place in week 1.

5. New General SSC Business

5.1 Co-option of Postgraduate Officer (Postgraduate Society)

Candidates nominated: Ariana Brighenti, Michael Hawes

Each candidate was given the allotted time for speeches and questions. After a ballot of SSC members Ariana Brighenti was co-opted and invited to join the Councils for the remainder of the meeting.

5.2 Discipline Committee vacancy

Ms Haswell-West was the only nominee and was elected to serve on the Discipline Committee without dissent.

5.3 Motion S.16-4: A Motion To Provide For The Co-option Of The SSC Member Without Portfolio

This motion was passed without amendment or dissent.

Joint business being completed, SSC members were allowed to leave.

6. New General SRC Business

6.1 Motion R.16-3: A Motion To Recommend That The University of St Andrews Divests its Endowment Fund From Fossil Fuel Extraction Companies Within Three Years

Ms Andrew introduced the motion, in support of a petition by students, academics and alumni. She explained that following developments over the summer, the content of the motion had been overtaken by events. As such she proposed to replace the original motion with the amended version, recognizing that the funds in question had either divested from fossil fuel extraction or would shortly do so. Ms Simeonova seconded the amendment.

Thanks were recorded to Fossil Free St Andrews for their work in persuading the University to divest from fossil fuel extraction.

Ms Bennett asked whether the University had ruled out future investments in funds involving fossil fuel extraction: Ms Andrew replied that although the University had a general commitment to ethical investment, there was as yet no specific commitment to not investing in this type of fund. However, she intended to pursue such a commitment on behalf of the SRC.

The amendment was passed without dissent.

Following discussions about the timeline of the divestment by one fund, ATI, a further amendment to the motion was proposed as follows:

Add Resolves clause 5: The Association President will engage with the University to review the timeline on which ATI will no longer be associated with fossil fuel extraction companies.

Proposed: Charlotte Andrew, seconded: Lorraine Callaghan.

This amendment was also passed without dissent. The motion as amended was passed without dissent.
