3.1 Report of the Athletic Union President

3.5 Report of the Association Director of Student Development & Activities

- Race 2 happened and was successful.
- Rag Week is happening next week.
- Working on the volunteering portal. It will be hopefully ready before spring break.
- Refreshers Fayre on Saturday.
- Room booking: all officers can book rooms through the online portal —not at reception, unless they have particular requests.
- The Student Project Fund is still open, as well as the Student Activities Fund. The Scott Lang dinner will be launched soon.
- 4. New General Joint Business

There was no new general joint business.

5. New General SRC Business

There was no new general SRC business.

6. New General SSC Business

There was no new general SSC business.

7. Any Other Competent Business

Mr Tantillo summarised the proposed changes in the elections' rules. The main changes are:

- elections are happening a week later;

- sabbatical candidates' statements will be 350-word long, and those for non-sabbatical candidate will be 250-word long;

- campaigning will start the day after nominations close;
- halls' husting will be organised by halls and will not be mandatory for sabbs;
- campaigners will be allowed again to give out bakes goods;
- rules breaches will be publicised on the voting portal;
- the budget for sabbs will be £100, and £35 for non-sabbs;

- Sabbatical candidates should collect 25 signatures in order to be able to stand.

Mr Tantillo was arranging for the Sabbs' debate to be live streamed, and he will encourage halls to organise viewing of the debates.

The proposal of asking halls to organise hustings was discussed and received mixed opinions. Ms Mullin proposed that sabbatical candidates should at least be required to attend some of the hustings. Ms Andrew acknowledged the fact that hustings often register a low turnout. However, the alternative of only having a live stream means reducing human contact. She highlighted that it is important for students to attend, especially first year students, to make them interested in the activities of the Students' Association. It is the Students' Association's responsibility to advertise more and to improve the hustings. Mr Ciric agreed. Mr Tantillo replied that halls can reach out to their students better and, therefore, advertise better. Mr Dixon stated that, if the Students' Association organises the hustings, there is more control. This will ensure that they are organised in a fair manner.

Ms McCaul noticed that there is no PG position in the rules yet. Mr Tantillo replied that they are looking at the PG Convenor's role description.

Ms Newman was against the proposal of asking sabbatical candidates to collect 25 signature in order to stand. Ms Thompson was concerned about this point, too, because it could discourage less confident people. Mr Tantillo said that this was just a proposal and that it aimed to reduce the number or people deciding to run at the last minute. The discussion on the elections rules changes finished.

Ms Evans reminded all to send her their semester 1 reports. She also asked everybody to send Ilaria their role descriptions.

The meeting adjourned.
