A MOTION TO INCLUDE STUDENTS ON LEAVE OF ABSENCE IN THE STUDENTS' ASSOCIATION ELECTIONS

OWNER: Elections Committee IN EFFECT FROM: Immediately REVIEW DATE: April 2016

THIS SSC & SRC NOTE:

- 1. That the Elections Committee for the Students' Association Elections 2015 recommended to the Councils to clarify the status of students on a leave of absence as ordinary members of the Students' Association and their eligibility to stand, campaign, and vote for in an election.
- 2. That the Elections Committee recommended that students on a leave of absence who are expected to return in the following academic year are given the same rights of ordinary members of the Students' Association and therefore allowed to stand, campaign, and vote in the Students' Association Elections.

THIS SSC & SRC BELIEVES:

 That the Students' Association should give students on a leave of absence who are expected to resume studies in the following academic year a platform for getting involved.

THIS SSC & SRC RESOLVES:

- 1. To allow all students on a leave of absence to campaign in Students' Association Elections.
- 2. To allow students on a leave of absence who are expected to resume studies at the beginning of the following academic year to stand and vote in the Students' Association Elections.
- 3. To mandate the Elections Committee to come up with an appropriate definition of ordinary membership of the Students' Association and investigate whether the proposed amendment would also necessitate a change in the Constitution of the Students' Association.
- 4. To encourage Sabbatical Officers and staff in the Students' Association to provide appropriate support to all candidates in the Students' Association Elections.

Last week saw our final Visiting Day of the year, and it all went by without a hitch. Our WP Vice-Principal ambassadors are currently working on organising a WP Reception to thank all our ambassadors who have volunteered on projects this year, and will be inviting staff and teachers involved in our projects along to this. We are also currently working on handing over to the new Principal Team for 2015-2016.

RECTOR'S ASSESSOR- ANNIE NEWMAN

We've been busy with fundraising for/administering the Rectors' Fund. Pat, Catherine, and I attended a fundraising dinner on Wednesday night and raised £14,000 for the fund - the equivalent of 28 scholarships for students to undertake summer internships.

With over 85 applications for the scholarships, the most we've ever recieved, we gave away £10,000 to 20 second and third year undergraduates and postgraduates, leaving £4,000 in the bank to pursue a long term strategy in terms of the Fund's finances. Some of the places these students are interning include the Assembleé Nacional, an LGBT rights NGO in Berlin, the U.S. Embassy in Moscow, an archeology site in Finland, and right here in St Andrews.

Besides the Rectors' Fund, we hosted our second talk in the Rector Inspirer Lecture Series with Dr Beth Breeze on Friday, as part of the Alumni Festival Weekend.

 - -I've managed to form a subcommittee to help me organise everything; this includes members of LGBT, Wellbeing, Sexpression and hopefully one of the sports clubs

 - -The message will be distributed through Social Media, the Union (and hopefully University) website, local and national press with a video, infographics, posters and banners, merchandise etc
