ARTS/DIVINITY FACULTY PRESIDENT

ASSOCIATION ALUMNI OFFICER

The Alumni Committee have had our first meeting of the new year, with several plans now set in motion. We have a brand new logo sorted and clothing will soon be ordered, which is great news. We're currently trying to organise a careers focused event for Green Week and we're arranging the preparations for the Alumni Festival Weekend, which is being held 15th-18th April 2016.

Very soon, we will be sending out emails and releasing invites for subcommittee and society heads to attend a drinks reception where our plans for the Festival will be laid out, and we will ask for your help in arranging events across the weekend. We'd like to be as creative, broad in appeal and ambitious as possible- so please start to think about what alumni would be drawn to and what you can offer.

Equally, if you are holding any large celebrations or anniversary events that alumni may be interested in, or would like to set up your own alumni network programmes, let me know and we will be happy to help out.

ASSOCIATION COMMUNITY RELATIONS OFFICER

Welcome back to St Andrews everyone!

Before we detail our current projects, we would like to continue to encourage any society, subcommittee or individual that interacts with the community for any of its projects to approach us if they would like help promoting said projects, or need help finding appropriate contacts within the community. We want to help!

Over the summer holidays, the Community Relations Committee has been hard at work looking for opportunities to cooperate with other groups to improve town and gown relations. We now have a Facebook page (www.facebook.com/stacomrels) set up to promote community events and student safety, and an email list for those interested in more details about what we do. We are working with Transition, the E-Car club and Fife Council to see if we can get more e-car parking bays in the centre of town, and are also working on producing a database of local contacts for future use. Additionally, our Outreach Officers are putting together a database of volunteering and outreach schemes run by university societies so that we can more effectively promote student interaction with the town. Finally, we are also already looking at awareness materials (including online safety posters and hard copy materials for halls

and student hotspots) for Raisin, and for cycle safety as the days start to become shorter.

ASSOCIATION ENVIRONMENT & ETHICS OFFICER

During Freshers week the E and E subcommittee successful hosted three events, a Green Fair (with Transition and other Green societies and community groups), beach BBQ and Green Walk. The events were chosen to raise awareness of the subcommittee and also to create a volunteer pool for later events in the year. With Green Week coming up (3-11th October), E and E is hosting and facilitating events and campaigns, as well as focusing on community engagement through the Botanics and local schools. During the summer, I was approached by a student and I am currently working on a Divestment proposal of the University endowment fund, alongside External Campaigns. The University currently follows an ethical investment policy, however one company on the portfolio is a natural gas company from Papua New Guinea, which if it were removed would mean that the University would be completely divested of all fossil fuels.

SRC EXTERNAL CAMPAIGNS OFFICER

External Campaigns has been pretty busy speaking with various societies on their plans for the coming year. These are too numerous to note, and I will be continuing to discuss these with the relevant societies and individuals, whilst continuing to engage with new societies and individuals over the coming two weeks.

Mores specifically, External Campaigns was at a rally last Saturday at the Edinburgh Parliament with a small number of St Andrews students. This was to show support for allowing further refugees into the UK. This is the kind of event we want St Andrews students to be able to access. We are currently working with the town and gown Refugee Action St Andrews group, giving them access to the Union mainframe and resources to enable their campaign.

Other projects we are actively working on right now are Divestment (largely in a support role to Environment and Ethics who are taking the lead rather successfully on this), Prevent (anti-terrorism legislation related to university activities), and the current consultation on RUK student fee repayment.

The summer has been a whirlwind of activity. I am now a member of a group based in London that is trying to connect all the BME/Black/Anti-racism officers in the country so that they can work together on different issues. A Motion to Introduce a Funding Cap for Societies

OWNER: Societies Committee IN EFFECT FROM: Immediately REVIEW DATE: December 2015

THIS SSC AND SRC NOTE:

- In the preceding four years, a small number of societies have received a majority of the Association's funding allocated for Societies.
- Some societies receive more Association funding than some SSC subcommittees
- The SSC Societies Committee are in the processes of amending its funding process

THIS SSC AND SRC BELIEVE:

- The current funding mechanism encourages larger, wealthier societies to pursue more ambitious events with Association funding, at the expense of resources available to smaller societies.
- The money allocated for affiliated societies would better serve the Association as a whole if it were distributed across a more diverse range of student activities.
- As well as the value of the aforementioned diversity, there is value to some large and ambitious events to the extent that they are worthy of the Association's financial support.

THIS SSC AND SRC RESOLVE:

- To submit the following amendments to the Laws of the Association to the Students' Association Board, with the recommendation that the same do pass:
 - o To insert into Chapter Nine a new §5.4 with the following text, and renumber accordingly
- 4. The Committee shall not be competent to authorise funding in excess of £2000 to any society in any academic year without the approval of the SSC. Notwithstanding the provision of 5.3, this provision may not be waived at the Committee's discretion.
