Environment Officer – Lauren Davis

What have I done since my last report?

Week 6 has been quite low key with everyone working on their fast approaching deadlines.

What progress has been made on my manifesto? (if applicable)

In Week 7, the Bike User Group meeting will take place from 3:30-5pm in the Union on Monday (28thOctober); this group is made up of students, staff, and locals. In this meeting I chair, we plan to push the Bike Lights Campaign (sun goes down earlier now, everyone needs lights) and talk about an idle car campaign as the number of cars travelling short distances around town and might idle for 10+ minutes in the mornings or evenings, releases a significant amount of emissions in a very short time period. As part of this, I have been working with Transition and a close alumni group on car-use and we are going to see what we can do to increase the number of student cyclists, decrease car use, or at least inform the public of the issues with cars in this small town in the winter time when stalled, or when travelling short distances. Pamphlets and documents might be made available soon.

The Environment Subcommittee has many plans to work with the Environment Hall Reps on waste-free campaigns and energy-saving projects. Coming up soon, we're going to launch our Interhall Energy Competition, it has been completely redone, so we're expecting better results and more participation going forward.

What do I hope to achieve by next report? (What it says on the tin)

The Student Travel Survey closes on 27th October, so I will be working with relevant groups to see how we can calculate the carbo footprint of student for the Carbon Management Plan. In addition to this, we plan to help Amnesty International with their Kenly Wind Farm project and petition to get the application seen through before its deadline in March. A petition and game plan will be discussed soon, so we can expand and get more students involved. In addition to this, I have met with the Community Engagement and Social Responsibility Officer regarding students push for more environmentally-friendly policies, and increased transparency for the students on what the University is doing well and is planning to do as part of our

strategic plan. One of the ideas which we have touched on, is that of a 'Zero Waste' shop in town, possibly helped and expanded through The Tree, with more student volunteers and staff to be involved. This is very much still a discussion, but the University administrators are listening, and they are working to meet demands of the students.

Why does what I'm doing matter to students, and how can they get involved? (As above)

We've had a number of students who want to get involved, so going forward and into next term we will be working with Estates/The Environment Team to get student reps from each university department to further implement 'Sustainability in the Curriculum.' More to come on that, and I'm sure we'll have more opportunities for students' as the semester goes on. We'll get more students involved with the Kenly Wind Farm discussion and we will also be asking for recommendations on what students want to see happen in this town in the next few months – whether that be events, motions to councils, etc.

What have I done since my last report?

I have got confirmation that representatives of Fife Rape and Sexual Assault Centre, Got Consent and a psychology professor doing research on sexual violence will sit on the discussion panel about why awareness of sexual and gender based violence matters to St Andrews on Tuesday 19th November. I am still awaiting responses from a few more external charities.

As not all gender-related societies were attending the biweekly meetings, I decided to create a collaborative group on Facebook. I think it has been a more coherent way of getting everyone involved. So far, I have summarised the collaborative events with details of dates in the lead up to Reclaim the Night as well as an overview of the ideas I have for the Gender Equality festival happening next semester.

I attended a pronoun consultative meeting with the Proctor with Parker, Flora and Amy about how staff can be inclusive of trans students with the language and gestures made.

What progress has been made on my manifesto?

I have established better communicative efforts between gender-related societies. I have made working on events which ensures gender-related issues reach a wide audience.

What do I hope to achieve by next report?

Confirmation of space for the discussion panel on SGBV as well as full confirmation list of panelists and three questions to initiate the discussion.

Following from an SGBV working group meeting, I have been researching the campaign on ending street harassment and will be looking at ways to tackle this in St Andrews: whether through making amendments to the SGBV motion or through a campaign.

I will also be investigating how to implement some form of SGBV awareness training for external organisations.

I intend to set up a meeting with someone from GotConsent to investigate the possibility of creating an informative poster to be displayed in halls.

Why does what I'm doing matter to students, and how can they get involved?

Keeping students informed about the avenues of help and action against GBV. Ensuring gender-related events reach a large audience. Facilitating communication between gender-related societies.

What have I done since my last report?

All multicultural week events are going up this weekend. The Food Festival has nearly 1000 responses on the Facebook event which is incredible! I will be putting together the final details with my committee.

What progress has been made on my manifesto? (if applicable) I am continuing to make sure Multicultural Week is a success!

SRC Arts/Divinity Faculty President – Sophia Rommel

What have I done since my last report?

I attended the first School Presidents' Forum of the academic year. It was lovely to see the School Presidents so engaged with and motivated about improving issues to do with the Careers Centre, wellbeing representatives, and MEQ structures. We all had a fruitful discussion with the Deans and the Proctor, so I think some concrete progress will be made in the above areas.

Moreover, I have discussed the prospect of creating an Interdisciplinary Magazine for the Arts- and Div-related Schools with several School Presidents (this idea came up during the aforementioned Forum). The School President of Film Studies has emailed me about this idea and, thus, I decided to ask Amy to put it on the next EduComm Agenda, so we can discuss it in greater detail with the EduComm group.

Amy and myself also met with the School President of English to discuss some feedback-related issues, and we have also met with the School President of Management to sort out a HR-related issue she has been experiencing. Hopefully, both these issues are now resolved!

In response to the aims set out in my last report, the Arts- and Div-related School Presidents publicised my office hours to all students in their weekly emails, so all students in the Faculty should now be aware of where and when they can find me in person, if they have anything they would like to discuss.

Lastly, Dennis and I have also discussed meeting at some point in the near future to discuss the ID modules' SSCCs.

What progress has been made on my manifesto?

Honestly, I'm sticking to my main manifesto points of helping School Presidents (with questions, their projects, School-related issues, etc.), working alongside Dennis on E&D and wellbeing issues, and planning an interdisciplinary discussion panel for next Semester, as noted in a prior report.

I have also extended beyond my manifesto, which I intended to do anyway as this role is about representing students' voices to the best of one's abilities, to work on
