SRC REPORTS

ARTS/DIVINITY FACULTY PRESIDENT & SCIENCE/MEDICINE FACULTY PRESIDENT

Education Committee has been busy with class rep elections, with the largest number of nominations is recent years this time round- congrats to all the School Presidents. They should all be fully trained by the end of this week, ready for their SSCCs.

Sally & I elected class reps for the ID4001/2 modules and will be looking to set a date for the SSCC in Week 8 (reduced from 2 to 1 SSCC in the semester on discussion with module coordinators).

We also went to our first Academic Council of the year, and met the new Principal for the first time- discussion items included Widening Access schemes, effects of the HE Governance Bill on the make up of the Senate and update on TEF's implementation in Scottish Universities.

Sally also went to the Teaching Infrastructure User Group and invites feedback from anyone with student perspective on current IT software, lecture presentation methods etc.

ASSOCIATION ALUMNI OFFICER

This week I've been in contact with a group of alumni who are coming up to St Andrews for a reunion weekend. With help from the School of Medicine President I have arranged a tour of the building for them, as well as recommending activities and putting them in touch with the Development Office in the hopes they'll contribute to their Alumni Magazine.

My subcommittee finally has a permanent meeting time that works for everyone (**Mondays 5pm** weeks 4, 6, 8, 10), which anyone is welcome to attend. We're currently working on some career-related joint events with other subcommittees, and our Societies Festival Launch event.

I have meetings with Development, Careers Centre, and Student Services arranged to discuss the Alumni Mentoring Scheme. We have 10 students for our pilot study, so we will begin matching them with Alumni mentors over the next few weeks.

Below is part of my report that I gave to SSC, but which is relevant to you guys as well!:

LGBT+ is enthusiastic for Mental Health First Aid training for committee members, considering some of the advances that are made upon committee, who need to be equipped to deal with some of the discussions that are had. This has been requested from the DoRep. We are also insisting as a committee that a Gender Neutral Bathroom is installed imminently; it is to the detriment of the Student's Association that this has not already been done, and it does not reflect the progressive and libertarian ideals that the Association proudly stands for.

LGBT+ are beginning a clothing initiative aimed at transgender students. Clothing donations will be asked for, and hopefully this will create a pool of resources available to students who are beginning to transition, and lessen the already hugely expensive burden placed upon these students. More about this is to follow, and I will ask that all of your subcommittees publicise a clothing drop-off at one of your events.

SAEC passed a motion to restructure the LGBT+ committee. We now have a dedicated Campaign Officer position, and after this is elected at the EGM we hope to roll our multiple campaigns this semester. The motion also validated the '+' at the end of LGBT, and we are therefore now officially referred to as 'LGBT+' in all Union laws, constitutions, and wherever else we may be mentioned.

ASSOCIATION EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES OFFICER

- The Strategic plan has been redone awaiting some members to edit, but should be ready for publication within the next couple of days.
- Been in contact with an external recruiter and in collaboration with the employability officer and careers centre we're promoting careers events for women in technologies, 'LGBT Leaders', and those with disabilities in finance.
- International reception is on the 5th October in Beacon Bar catering and marketing is sorted. Facebook event and posters go on show tomorrow.

- Poetry event on the 12th three speakers already interested, looking for more been in contact with inklight.
- Wheels are moving on well with Pangea Photo shoot is taking place this Sunday.
- Masculinity and Mental health we're branding off into smaller groups for this - one speaker (an author) has responded expressing enthusiasm.

RECTOR'S ASSESSOR NO REPORT SUBMITTED

SRC ACCOMMODATION OFFICER

Here is the report for the SRC accommodation Officer since starting the role in May 2016 until the end of September 2016.

The motion to change the subcommittee structure has been submitted and approved. The event with the application form for a committee of three new members (a private accommodation, halls and communications representative) is live at https://www.facebook.com/events/1790482974574648/. These positions should be interviewed and appointed by the end of the week of 3rd October. The Postgraduate Development Officer, Alison Holiday, will also be sitting on my committee.

Over the summer a senior students' Facebook group was created with the Dean's Court Senior Student recently joining. This group included the Saabs and the Charities Campaign Halls Officer and has seen consistent activity since its creation. Alongside this I also asked senior students what updates they would like to see on their Halls pages on the university website and updated We have held two senior student forums with lots of them accordingly. feedback coming from the senior students about what issues they are facing. As part of this I am now creating a handover document for the senior students which will include the constitutions and committee structures of all the Halls of Residence. I am also drafting a model constitution for Halls committees as some of the halls do not have one. I have reached out to IT about training the IT reps in each hall and they have expressed interest in this. More cohesive information about the changing of bank signatories regarding halls of residence will be discussed at the Hall of Residence Committees Working Group and I will be discussing with Ben about training committees to have an alcohol license, both things with seniors students have expressed concern over.

The PAVS scheme was publicised over Facebook with a good response however due to a lack of student volunteers with training Iain Cupples had to do a lot of the inspections himself. He and I will be meeting soon to discuss recruitment, training and publicity in preparation for the next round of the PAVS scheme.

I had a meeting with Ben, the Residential Business Services Director, the morning of Thursday 8th September and he is attending our next senior student forum Tuesday 4th October at 2pm. This is because some of the senior students expressed concern over the redevelopments happening in Halls in particular Albany Park. I also met with Catriona Wilson from CAPOD and Wednesday 14th at 4pm and we discussed the training halls committees receive and any feedback sessions we could hold. From this we have decided to hold a Review of first semester with the senior students at noon Monday 28th November which will include free pizza as an incentive. This review will allow us to determine what extra top-up training to provide in February second semester. I am also meeting with Penny Turnbull from Student Services next week to discuss how we can work together over the next year. The meeting of the Hall of Residence Committees working group has also been confirmed for Friday 7th October.

The first steps of the rebrand have been taken with Rachel Kinloch aware of my plans for the year and initial ideas drafted, however this has not been able to progress further without someone in charge of marketing for the subcommittee.

Emails have been sent to the major letting agents in St Andrews asking them about their system and release dates for properties in order to update the How to Rent Guide and I have received some replies. Halls have also been informed of my intention to include pages on each Hall of Residence in the guide as part of the information on reaffiliation. As a third addition to this guide I would like to include more information about privately managed university accommodation.

I also had my first meeting with Charlotte where we discussed what I have been up to and what my plans are for the rest of the year.

SRC MEMBER FOR RACIAL EQUALITY

I ran my first safe space and a few people showed up which is more then I was expecting. I am mostly just working on Pangea and right now all we have to get done is room bookings and do a final confirmation with the cultural societies. I have started to work with students from South America to see how we can work together to host events that will educate on their different cultures and the problems their continent faces.

SRC MEMBER FOR FIRST YEAR

SRC MEMBER FOR GENDER EQUALITY

The projects I am working on are:

1) A visual campaign: wondering about possibility of running a poster campaign or information leaflet type thing with definitions/explanations of terms related to differences in gender and sexuality as well as terms such as feminism, gender equality etc. Possibility of collaborating with FemSoc and LGBT to get the definitions from students themselves – similar to the Cambridge 'We

- 2) I am currently talking to Ben Peddie about running a series of workshops run by a group in Oxford called The Good Lad initiative. We will hopefully get male athletes to participate in the workshops at the start of semester 2. I am meeting with Alison Holiday (Post Graduate development) today to discuss the setting up of a Mature Student Association.

I have been in touch with registry to seek their support in setting up a Mature Student database and I am awaiting a response.

A survey for Mature students seeking their feedback on Mature student issues is work in progress.

SRC MEMBER FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Me and Sam Ross have planned an event next Wednesday about positivity taking place in the Mansfield building. I met with Ben Lawrie about the masculinity and mental health but as those of you who received the email know then we will have to hold a wider meeting about this to solve issues and take in others viewpoints. I am still waiting on replies from the sports teams about the poster campaign for that. I have yet to meet with Sheila Bailey (Disability Advisor) as she is still busy with new students. I have drawn up the budget plan for Introspect and have met with Keith Siller (head of Psychology) to gain his approval and support, his department are happy to cover some of the costs as well. A member of the union's design committee is doing some new posters and flyers which should be ready within a week or two. We also have 3 confirmed speakers for the event. We already have as many artists signed up at this stage as we had in total last year, so hopefully the exhibition will be much larger and varied. Dealt with individual disabled student's appointment/accomodation issue.

SRC MEMBER FOR WIDENING ACCESS AND PARTICIPATION

- 1. With support from the UK Admissions team, develop a network of current students, by the end of academic year 2016/17, with an aim of making contact with institutions currently underrepresented at the University of St Andrews.
- 2. Work with Residential Business Services to create, by December 2016, an ongoing system by which commuting students can gain access to affordable University of St Andrews accommodation during the academic year.

3. To arrange a meeting, by October 2016, with the International Admissions Department of the University of St Andrews to ascertain their views on Widening Access and offer assistance towards that goal.

SRC POSTGRADUATE ACADEMIC OFFICER NO REPORT SUBMITTED SRC POSTGRADUATE DEVELOPMENT OFFICER

Since the last meeting I have been involved in PGR induction and essentials events which were well received and allowed me the opportunity to explain my role to new members of the postgraduate community. I was invited by Heather McKiggan-Fee to join the Innovation grant judging panel, we met and assigned funds in the first round of funding. I have started attending Wellbeing committee meetings as the postgraduate voice and have hosted another of the Postgraduate development meetings that I hold on a monthly basis with various members of staff from services which deal with postgraduate matters. Finally, I intend to meet with the Member for Age equality and discuss mature students/ older postgraduates and postgraduates with families and how they may better be served within the union e.g. with a mature students society.
