SRC Disability Officer – Anna-Ruth Cockerham

What have I done since my last report?

Since my last report, I ran an open forum with disabled students to discuss the results of the survey that we ran last semester. Since then I have been working on a report of the results and highlighting our five priority actions for the next semester. The actions we have highlighted are:

- Improving incoming students' knowledge of the disability support available when they first come to university;
- Improving the experiences of students accessing support from Student Services and their department;
- Improving accessibility of the university estate;
- Ensuring that improvements to the accessibility of learning remain post-COVID;
- Tackling disability-based stigma and discrimination, and encouraging a broader understanding of disability;

Many of these issues are things I have already been exploring and working on, and we have been working to find solutions to some of these key issues like potentially working with Admissions and examining the support available for commuting students.

I have also been working with members of the DSN Committee to plan events and projects for the next semester, including finalising our plans for a campaign on mental health conditions and beginning planning a campaign on invisible disabilities.

What progress has been made on my manifesto?

My manifesto points quite broadly cover the needed actions highlighted in the survey and the results of the survey will hopefully help me target these issues with the University. Alongside that, progress has been made on starting a working group on physical access with Emma (DoWell) and I have been working on webpages for disability support in each academic school with Chloe (SciMedFP) and Disabilities Forum.

I really want to gain a deeper understanding into the working of these areas within the university and how we can make this more accessible for widening access students.

This involves collecting and gathering data from research into one so we can attribute which areas need focus on and in what way. I am particularly focusing on the awareness of scholarships and bursaries for freshers but also the need for revision in current areas of financial help available to students.

By next report, I want to discuss areas of collaboration with the Rectors Committee and Sports Participation barrier group further, so we can start working towards ideas for collaboration events in the coming weeks.

Arts/Divinity Faculty President – Joe Horsnell

What have I done since my last report?

- Met with Dr Lisa Jones to discuss the William & Mary Transition Report, which she agreed to help us implement
- Coordinated the Study Buddy Scheme 2020, which matched students in similar year groups and Schools together. This was designed to combat exam stress, isolation and loneliness during one of the most difficult times of the pandemic for a lot of students. Emma (DoWell), Amy, (DoEd), Octavia (Peer Support Coordinator), Gabby (Member for Student Health), Jasmine (PG Development Officer) and Katy were instrumental to its success. We had 70 pairings in the end!
- Attended School Presidents Forum
- Met with the BAME Education Officer and EDI Faculty Leads to discuss progress on EDI goals and the BAME Action Plan

- Stood in for the Director of Education at the Film Studies School Review and joined the review team in providing recommendations and commendations to the School
- Attended a meeting of SA Trustees
- Met with Craig Phillips (Assistant Director of the Careers Centre) to discuss outcomes from Semester 1 and areas the Careers Centre could have improved upon. We also discussed ways in which School Presidents could be further supported
- Met with the School President for English to discuss issues around deadlines in his School
- Chaired the final Education Committee meeting of the Semester
- Chaired the final School Presidents Advisory Group (Careers) (SPAG) alongside the Assistant Director of the Careers Centre
- Met with the Director of Student Development and Director of Education to discuss the Employability Strategy and Careers Week
- Attended a Finance Subcommittee meeting of the SA Board
- Attended the final Board meeting of 2020
- Coordinated and chaired an extraordinary meeting of Education Committee to discuss plans for Semester 2 (including which mitigation measures the School Presidents would like to push for – e.g. s-coding)
- Have begun coordinating another iteration of the Study Buddy Scheme to help students to cope with the current situation (many students are scattered across the world)
- Prepared motions to write SWAG and SPAG into the laws and re-instate the Employability Officer (spent time writing up the position description)

What progress has been made on my manifesto?

- I have continued to ensure School Presidents are well-supported and we have made a small amount of progress on EDI goals
- A lot of my time is spent on Careers-oriented goals and progress was made here

What do I hope to achieve by next report?

- A second, successful iteration of the Study Buddy Scheme
- Firmer plans for the Careers Centre-Students Association collaboration
- Further progress on EDI goals including sorting out the BAME Reporting Tool on the Union website

What have I done since my last report?

• On Friday last week Dr. Leyla Hussein and I attended the first Court meeting of her Rector term.

- This past week following court I have had productive conversations concerning action, accountability, and access at our university with individual court members.
- My team has begun running spotlight weeks via our Instagram account. Last week we ran a successful and engaging Activism and Outreach spotlight. This week we are running an Accommodation spotlight.
- Our committee's social media growth has been a source of pride. This week our Instagram account passed more than 1,000 followers.

What progress has been made on my manifesto.

- Our manifesto is split into three sections: Access, Action and Accountability.
- Under Access our racial equality coordinators have produced a racial equality questionnaire which is currently being circulated through the student body. We are also working with the mental health task force and the equally safe initiative to create a mental health class.
- Under Accountability we have launched a sexual based gender violence (SBGV) working group chaired by Dr. Leyla Hussein. This group has had its first meeting and will be meeting again soon. R21-01 Motion to promote trade union membership and direct students in employment to support

Owner: Dan Marshall In Effect From: Immediately Review Date: N/A

It is noted that:

- 1. At the last census in 2011, 32% of students in Scotland said they worked part time alongside their studies [1]
- 2. Many students in St Andrews have experienced bullying and harassment at work and other examples of poor working conditions. This was highlighted by an investigation by the Saint in 2017. [2]
- 3. In 2019 members of trade unions earned on average 10.3 percent more than the average worker in the United Kingdom. [3]
- 4. In the United Kingdom, every worker has the right to join a trade union [4]
- 5. The Students' Association is not a trade union and so does not represent its members in employment matters.
- 6. At present, the Students' Association provides no formal advice, support or signposting for students in their capacity as workers.

It is believed that:

- 1. The Students' Associations should actively direct students to information about their rights at work and to organisations which can help them.
- 2. That every worker should have the opportunity to join a union and should be encouraged to do so.
- 3. The pandemic has made it more important than ever for students to understand the rights they have as workers.

It is resolved that:

- 1. The Association President be mandated to create a section of yourunion.net/support to signpost students in work to help and advice for organisations including Citizens Advice Scotland and the Scottish Trades Union Congress.
- 2. The Association will work with the Careers Centre to ensure that students have access to information about their rights at work when looking for part time employment as is done at the University of York. [5]
- 3. The Association will encourage students in work to consider trade union membership.
