On the Thursday following Joint Councils a fortnight ago, we held Rave2, with the hope of using the funds of that particular event to bring down the entry price of Race2 as a whole. Ticket sales were a success and we are pleased to announce that we have been able to decrease Race2 entry price from £60 to £55 following the success of the event. We are looking into the feasibility of organising such events in aid of the three nominated charities in the future. It is is also worth noting that the required sponsorship for racers is set at £200 per racer – an increase from last year's minimum of £150. This is still less compared other university's hitchhikes (e.g. Edinburgh's Race2 Paris has a min sponsorship of £250). It is important to note that everything raised in sponsorship goes directly to the charities – the £55 covers all costs (2 nights at the hostel, transportation at the beginning of the race, racer packs, 24/7 safety team etc). Race2Barcelona ticket sales are happening in the 601 foyer, Thursday 5th October from 6:30pm.

Next Thursday is our Cheque Presentation. Representatives from each of the 2016/2017 charities are due to be coming to St Andrews next week – Thursday 5th Oct, 5pm, Beacon Bar. It would be great to see you all along!

Our applications closed on Friday 22nd, and I am happy to day that we had over 230 applicants for our 40 different volunteering opportunities. On Monday 25th we had our decision meeting, where the Project Officers and I allocated applicants to volunteering projects. This coming week we have our volunteer training, which is split into three sessions to cater to the different requirements of our projects: Dementia Awareness training, Child and Adult Protection training and general training (for our community, animal and environment projects). After training, most volunteers shall be able to get started on their projects, which is very exciting!
