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FROM THE CAMPAIGN TEAM

Jonathan Edwards is one of Britain's most successful ever athletes. During his career as a professional triple jumper, he won the Olympic gold medal in Sydney 2000 and set the world record for the men's triple jump- a record that still stands 28 years on. After his retirement from professional athletics, Jonathan went on to be the athlete representative on the Organising Committee Board for the London 2012 Olympic and Paralympic Games, where he was instrumental in establishing structural change to provide athletes with a stronger voice. In addition to this, he was the Deputy chair of the Nations and Regions group that was established to grow the impact of the games to a wider and more inclusive audience. He has a wealth of experience representing the concerns of others and representing the issues that matter most to them at the very highest level. In his broadcasting career, Jonathan was part of Channel 4's ground-breaking coverage of the Paralympic Games and has recently been appointed as a charity trustee of the Invictus games foundation- a charity dedicated to supporting wounded, injured and sick veterans. Jonathan's connection to St Andrew's student community began in 2011, when is eldest son, Sam, began studying here. His connection has continued unbroken, with his niece and now nephew choosing St Andrews. He would be honoured to be elected as our Rector and have the opportunity to bring both his professional experience and personal dedication to this historic role, the ultimate goal of ensuring every student has the best possible experience.

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STUDENT ADVOCACY

- Understand and Immerse themselves in the St Andrews community
- ▶ Build key relationships with the student-elected officers, particularly the Sabbs & SRC, university senior staff, and the community as a whole
- On the ground, accessible and available student representative
- Attendance at University meetings, events and ceremonies

KEY DEFINED RESPONSIBILITIES

- University Court - 'Ordinary President' and voting member of the Universities highest-level decision-making body
- Rectors Fund Principle Fundraiser and Patron of scholarship supporting students' career aspirations
- Alongside other court members, responsible for the stewardship of the Universities assets and compliance with relevant legislation and regulation

The Rector can open doors and help to release log-jams where the formal mechanisms for resolving issues appear to fail.

A Rector with the time, sincerity and commitment to get to know the student body and engage with their issues, and the skills to influence effectively, can make a valuable contribution to the student experience, as well as to the life and reputation of the whole University.

The Rector is a staunch student advocate and provides an important pastoral function, working outside but alongside official University structures for the informal resolution of issues and concerns.

HOW IS JONATHAN QUALIFIED TO BE RECTOR?

 - Deputy Chair of London 2012 Nations + Regions Group, making the games as inclusive as possible

As Rector, I would commit my first 100 days to meeting all of the elected student officers and their subcommittees face to face, to understand how the Rector can be part of their team and make a difference.



MAIN AIMS

- Create a strong working partnership with the students, their elected officers, and the wider university community
- > Amplify the student voice and supercharge their agenda
- Be immersed in St Andrews life, and make the role of the Rector relevant and visible

HOW WILL JONATHAN ACHIEVE THIS?

- During his first 100 days, Jonathan will meet with every studentelected officer to begin understanding their goals
- After 100 days, Jonathan will use these conversations to produce an informed draft report for agreement with our representatives, detailing the best working practice for the Rector
- Understand current communication channels between students and their elected officers, to ensure there are simple, accessible bridges from students > Sabbs > senior decision makers (court etc.)
- Review the structure of the Rector's Committee and the role of the Rector's Assessor.
- Encourage all student clubs to invite the Rector along to their meetings and events, to bring the Rector into the fullness of University life.

I think something that is often overlooked is the lack of structured channels through which students can direct their voice. I consider myself a very active and aware student, yet I still find myself frustrated with the inability to reach key decision-makers. - Cosmos MacKenzie, 3rd year

For me, my biggest worry, like numerous other students, is the accommodation crisis. An accessible home should be a given, not one of our biggest worries. The knock-on effect has left many people in less than adequate living situations, having to sacrifice basic sustenance. I dread to think of the situation in a few years time if we continue on this trajectory. - Michael Dunn, 4th year

- Operate as part of a joined-up team with the Sabbs/SRC
- Maximise the Rectors three-year term to create continuity, thus enabling long-term, sustainable, impactful change
