As you all know from the ping-pong ball stations at the library, the university is looking to consult you all on the academic calendar – specifically Semester 2.

### Why am I being consulted?


- A survey conducted by the Students' Association in 2021-22 indicated widespread student and staff discontent with the Academic Calendar for Semester 2.
- A major reason cited was academic burnout due to a shorter winter break and no spring break.

#### How will the survey results be used?

- This survey is purely consultative, not a vote.
- HOWEVER If there is a significant consensus for one particular model, the university will endeavor to change it for the next academic year (2024-25).
- If further consultation is necessary, then it will be pushed to 2025-26.
- We believe that it is in the student body's interest to come to a consensus, though the choice is ultimately your own.

- A majority believed that Model 2A is a good compromise between staff and student needs.

- It is important to note that this was the original model followed by the university but was changed due to significant staff discontent.

# Model 2B
