We hope you had a relaxing and well-deserved winter break and are excited for Semester 2.




Whether this semester is your first or your last, the Students' Association wants to help make it the most memorable one yet!

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- All the money you spend in our bars and cafés go back into the Students' Association, helping to fund activities, projects and events
- A lot of the Students' Association is run by student volunteers.
- We offer advice about private letting and provide a Private

- There are 22 subcommittees (or 'super societies') that are open to all matriculated students.
- The Students' Association trains and supports over **350 Class Reps**.
- The Education Committee which represents your academic interests meets weekly. School Presidents, the DoEd, Faculty Presidents and the PG Academic Convenor sit on this committee.
- The President, Director of Education, and Rector's Assessor sit on University Court, the governing body of the University.
- The **School Presidents' Forum** allows academic representatives to discuss issues with members of the Proctor's Office.
- Class Reps also advocate on library and employability issues.
- The student-led Teaching Awards is run every year to recognise and reward the excellent teaching that happens in St Andrews.
- We have a full-time Education Advocate, Academic Representation Co-ordinator and Wellbeing and Equality Co-ordinator who are here to help you.
- All affiliated societies can apply for funding from the Societies' Committee for projects and events.



Societies:

Subcommittees:

These are our 'super-societies' and as a St Andrews student you're automatically a member of all of them! Each subcommittee is active throughout the academic year, so you can join in at any point. We have 8 activities subcommittees including the Charities Campaign, Union Debating Society, Ents Crew, Saints LGBT+, Mermaids Performing Arts Fund, Music Is Love, On the Rocks (OTR) Arts Festival and STAR: St Andrews Student Radio.

Our subcommittees are at the heart of life in St Andrews and our student volunteers dedicate incredible amounts of time and energy to provide students with unique experiences and opportunities. As such the Students' Association and Saints Sport have joined forces to create the Volunteer Recognition Scheme to support student volunteers and enable them to easily log their volunteering hours, develop key skills for the future, and provide a platform whereby student achievements can be formally recognised by the University.

The Students' Association financially supports all kinds of student activities, whether that be through societies or individual efforts.

Student Project Fund

Any student or student group, to support any project not covered by another fund.

Societies Fund

All affiliated societies, to support affiliated societies in hosting events or purchasing equipment.

Employability Fund

All affiliated societies, Careers- or employability-based events.

Mermaids Performing Arts Fund

Any student group, Theatre, performing arts, or production.

Anthony Tudor Fund

Any student group (production must be affiliated with Mermaids or On the Rocks), Theatre, performing arts, or production.

Education Discretionary Fund

School Presidents and Class Reps, promoting Academic representation.

Rector's Fund

Any student with a confirmed internship offer. Creating positive change through internship projects.

Representation and Wellbeing

The Students' Association is your voice to the University, local community, and the wider world. Our elected officers and subcommittees will strive to make sure you are heard and represented.

The Student Representative Council (SRC) currently has 26 members who are elected in the spring each year. The SRC functions through its representational subcommittees, led by your elected SRC Officers.

We also have a number of Students' Representative Council subcommittees that are open for any student to attend and get involved in.

Accommodation:

The Union's Accommodation Team exists to help all students in private flats or halls of residence with any problems they might encounter during their time in St Andrews.

Alumni:

Its aim is to connect our global alumni to St Andrews, and current students with alumni.

The BAME network:

Our newest subcommittee, representing BAME students in St Andrews. They provide events, support, and a community for its members.

Community Relations:

The representative for all students with regards to community matters. In order to fulfil this role, they sit on a number of local committees.

Disabled Students' Network (DSN):

Dedicated to representing disabled students, signposting support, hosting events, and running campaigns that provide community to disabled students and promote an understanding of disability.

Education Committee (EduCom):

Represents student opinion on education issues, in conjunction with the University and beyond.

Environment:

Helps students live more sustainably and get involved in environmental projects around campus.

Equality Comittee:

Connects equality-focused SRC reps to share ideas and work collaboratively to address intersectional issues of equality and diversity in St Andrews.

Lifers:

Responsible for representing those students who have entered University after a break from education. They support a community which is made up of commuters, parents, postgraduates, evening and part time students.

Saints LGBT+:

A social and wellbeing group for people in the LGBT+ community. They run campaigns and celebrations to highlight important issues.

Wellbeing:

Focus their efforts around mental health, sexual health, personal safety, and alcohol consumption.

StAnd Together:

Not a SRC Subcom but a joint initiative between the Union and the University focused on studentled peer education and support. It's made up of 3 strands: GotConsent (consent and relationship education and bystander intervention training), GotLimits (drug and alcohol safety and inclusivity), GotSupport (peer support network).

The Help Hub also includes our **Education Advocate**, an adviser independent from the University who can support and advise you confidentially on academic alerts, appeals, and discipline cases.


