- In week 2 there will be the first meeting of the Russian Cinema Club and on Friday there will be a research afternoon about Russian Children's Literature (including a visit from two prominent researchers from Russia!) We are all very excited.
- The Language Convenors are planning a ModLang pub crawl for week 3 and the ball preparation continues."

#### Philosophy - Sophia Rommel - philosophypresident

- Humanities Careers Fayre on the 8th of Feb., alongside the Schools of History and Classics; lots of meetings, outreach and prep for this has been happening – very excited and grateful that so many alumni are coming to speak to students (Careers Department was very helpful in providing us with a long list of potential speakers)
- Most of my Class Reps will be at the Fayre, and my Social Rep will help set up
- My main role during the Fayre will be to greet, coordinate and oversee the speakers
- Promoting the Fayre through daily FB posts, posters (made by Rebecca), emails, word-

of-mouth, and through lecturers (who are promoting the Fayre in their lectures/tutorials). I have also invited lecturers to come see their former students during the Fayre, if they are interested, which may increase our turnout and general departmental enthusiasm for this event (everyone seems keen!)

- Much closer ties developed with Philosophy's PhD community through MAP, Society for Women and Minorities, and future planned events (including a 'Race in Philosophy Panel' which is currently being planned by myself, PhilSoc, and MAP)
- Currently reaching out to potential internal and external speakers, alongside Kirsty (from MAP and PhilSoc), for the 'Race in Philosophy Panel'. A general timeline has been drawn up, including a potential date (8th of April) for the event and a preliminary schedule (including dinner with the speakers, beforehand)
- Most of the funding for the above event will be through PhilSoc massive thank you to them!
- Met with Honours Reps and DOT regarding NSS results and their peculiar, often unwitting/ambiguous wording
- Also, discussed re-introducing cover sheets when students submit their assessed work, so students can see which skills they are applying and developing/required to apply based on the type of assessment, as well as gaining a general overview (split into categories) of their performance alongside their tutor's comments. This is done in psychology, which Kyle mentioned to us, and my DOT and I will bring this idea to our next TLA meeting
- At the next TLA, we will again be discussing exam (structure) reform, especially in light of the recent working group set up by my DOT for staff prior to the start of Semester 2
- Staff currently sending out 'thank you for your feedback' emails regarding MEQ comments (to ensure students know that their input is valued, taken and applied, and to increase enthusiasm for and the response numbers/rate for the next MEQ)
- Kyle (Honours Rep) and his friend Max Waller are setting up a 'Derek Parfit Reading Group' for Philosophy students; will promote it in my next School President email
- Kyle to meet with our DOT regarding his idea of an online Q&A system for undergraduates (project status: TBD)
- Meeting with all Class Reps on Wednesday (the 6th) to discuss collecting student feedback for our upcoming SSCC (on the 20th of Feb.), including changing a few of the questions we ask, in order to collect the feedback (MAP has helped draft one of the questions, focused on inclusivity, as we are increasing the Department's focus on E&D this Semester), as well as discussing any issues and/or ideas the Reps would like to raise (have kept the Reps updated on this meeting via email and our FB group and

private chats)

- Have updated DOT on EduComm meeting's comments regarding the NSS, bringing our concerns to the Deans at the next SPF, and on things to include in our SSCC Agenda (I create the Agenda, but felt that it would be good to run things by her, including the inclusion of External Examiner's Report and MEQ results)
- I am prioritising E&D issues this Semester; redrafting and alternations of our Handbook's 'Seminar Etiquette' guidelines, member of the School-wide E&D Committee, member of the working group (Self-Assessment Team) for the Athena Swan re-application which we are pursuing as a School, climate surveys (carried out by MAP, brought to our staff E&D Representative Professor Hawley and our very supportive DOT – I fully support MAP in constantly addressing E&D issues at both UG and PG level, as one must constantly work on these issues – one cannot merely 'address' them once and leave it at that, or no progress will be made)
- Looking into the prospects for a Buddy Scheme social (although my focus is currently on broader E&D issues, including the re-writing of our Athena Swan application (Schoolwide), and on the aforementioned Panel)
- CEPPA's Second Graduate Conference is also taking place on the 8th of Feb., after our Fayre (have worked with the PhD students organizing this to ensure that there is no major clash/overlap time-wise), until the 10th of Feb – should be a wonderful event (wholly organized by CEPPA and some PhD students), which I am promoting alongside our Fayre in my weekly emails
- Sent our last week's weekly email, and am about to send out this week's
