- 3. Matters Arising
 - a. NSS
 - i. The Dean of S&M thanks the students for the great engagement in NSS
 - ii. Areas that we did poorly in: Opportunities for students to work in groups, students to realise when they are working in groups; whether students know that the feedback is acted upon; library resources.
 - iii. We do well in teaching. Positive NSS data over the last 10 years through a statistics report
 - iv. The Dean of A&D asks to: articulate clearly to staff to assess whether there is enough 'good' teamwork opportunities.
 - v. How can we improve to let students know their feedback is acted upon?
 - 1. Show them how they made changes from previous years
 - 2. Publicise the minutes from SSCC
 - Mid-semester surveys are useful to gather feedback as well but needs to be seen an something coming from students because of survey fatigue.
 - vi. Note that internal changes can be quick, but policy changes take a lot of time due to the University Committees they must go through.
 - b. New Academic Alerts Policy
 - i. Academic alerts have changed.

- ii. One aspect is compulsory attendance monitoring. This is due to multiple reasons:
 - 1. Some schools have no attendance monitoring whatsoever and students disappear off the radar which is not good.
 - 2. Pastoral reasons.
 - 3. UK Visas immigration for the Tier 4 national students: The consequences for not complying with certain regulations would be that the University could not issue Tier 4 visas anymore and current visas could be revoked. This happened in two universities in the UK.
- iii. Schools can track attendance as they would like and as works best with their curricula.
- iv. In Arts Schools there are generally mandatory tutorials, so this is not a problem. For some Science schools this is quite a big change.
- v. Why an academic alert? Because it provides information to all the stakeholders. This may look more formal but is also necessary.

4. AOCB

- a. Lecture recording
 - There is a policy that says that everything a lecturer says in a recording could be used in discipline proceedings. This issue was brought as potentially being a reason some lecturers are reluctant to record their lectures.
 - ii. The Deans responded that this is only in exceptional circumstances.
 - iii. The policy was discussed in general.
 - iv. If SPs wanted to try to change the policy, they could write a proposal and send this on to their Sabbatical Officer (Alice) who would take this to the relevant University committees for approval.
