- Fund musical projects for individuals and societies wishing to run an independent gig or event
- Chair the Music is Love committee
- Serve on the Student Services Council

How you will be doing it:

- Making sure a variety of music events are hosted to maintain a stable platform for good-quality entertainment
- Host frequent open mic nights
- Collaborate with other organisations in St Andrews to bring music to events
- Communicate with followers and keep them up to date with events through online channels
- Make sure the Music is Love budget is spent responsibly
- Liaise with the Director of Events & Services, the Director of Student Development & Activities, Association staff and staff at other venues
- Attend SSC and Music is Love meetings

- Have a good idea of the market you're catering for and how to reach them
- A knowledge of music equipment and technology
- Effective money management
- Good motivational skills
- Be adaptable and communicative
- A decent understanding of the music industry and a good command in event organisation

Expected time commitment

Time commitment differs depending on how close to an event you are. On a normal week, it can range from 6-15 hours, but it can get to around 30-35 hours during the time of large events.
